DESCRIPTION OF THE MEDIUM-TERM NOTES

Applicable Interest Rate Index:	Federal Funds Rate (Daily); however, for purposes of the Medium-Term Notes offered pursuant to this Pricing Supplement, “Fed Funds Rate (Daily)” shall be the rate listed on the Designated Reuters Page for the applicable Fed Funds Rate Determination Date.
Designated Reuters Page:	Reuters US/FEDRATES1
Reset Frequency:	Daily
Reset Dates:	Daily
Fed Funds Rate Determination Date:	Daily, with respect to each day during the applicable Interest Payment Period not occurring during the Suspension Period; or the last day preceding the Suspension Period with respect to each day during the applicable Interest Payment Period occurring during the Suspension Period.
Spread:	Plus 45 basis points (+ 0.45 percentage points) subject to “Interest Rate” provisions, as described below.
Interest Rate:	45 basis points above the Fed Funds Rate (Daily), subject to a minimum interest rate of 0.00%. The Interest Rate will be adjusted on each Reset Date to reflect the Fed Funds Rate (Daily) for the applicable Fed Funds Rate Determination Date provided, however, if the Fed Funds Rate (Daily) is not published for any Business Day, then the Fed Funds Rate (Daily) will be the Fed Funds Rate (Daily) published on the immediately preceding Business Day.
Initial Interest Rate:	The initial interest rate for the Medium-Term Notes applicable from, and including, the Issue Date to, but excluding, the first Reset Date, will be equal to the Fed Funds Rate (Daily) for each day in the Interest Payment Period, plus the Spread, subject to the “Interest Rate” provisions above.
Floor for each day in the Interest Payment Period:	0.00%
Denomination:	\$1,000 minimum, \$1,000 multiples thereafter
Day Count Convention:	Actual/360 with no adjustment for period end dates.
Suspension Period	The period beginning on the seventh (7 th) Business Day prior to each Interest Payment Date (including the Maturity Date) to, but excluding, such Interest Payment Date.
Payment of Interest:	Quarterly, in arrears, on the 8 th day of January, April, July, and October (each such date, an “Interest Payment Date”), commencing April 8, 2009.

RISK FACTORS:

An investment in the Medium-Term Notes entails certain risks not associated with an investment in conventional fixed rate debt securities. See “Risk Factors” generally and “Various Factors Could Adversely Affect the Trading Value and Yield of Your Debt Securities” in the Offering Circular. The interest rate of the Medium-Term Notes will be equal to the Fed Funds Rate (Daily) *plus* a Spread of 45 basis points (+0.45 percentage points), subject to the “Interest Rate” provisions above. Investors should consider the risk that the variable interest rate on the Medium-Term Notes may be less than that payable on a conventional fixed rate debt security issued by Freddie Mac at the same time. Because the Medium-Term Notes may not pay a significant amount of interest for extended periods of time, the Medium-Term Notes are not a suitable investment for individuals seeking a steady stream of income.

The secondary market for, and the market value of, the Medium-Term Notes will be affected by a number of factors independent of the creditworthiness of Freddie Mac, including the level and direction of interest rates, the variable rate of interest payable on the Medium-Term Notes, the anticipated level and potential volatility of the Fed Funds Rate (Daily), the method of calculating the Fed Funds Rate (Daily), the time remaining to the maturity of the Medium-Term Notes, the aggregate principal amount of the Medium-Term Notes and the availability of comparable instruments. The level of the Fed Funds Rate (Daily) depends on a number of interrelated factors, including economic, financial and political events, over which Freddie Mac has no control. The following table, showing the level of the Fed Funds Rate (Daily) in effect for the Hypothetical Determination Dates listed below, illustrates the variability of that rate:
