The Medium-Term Notes have the same terms (other than Issue Date and Issue Price) as, and form a single series with, the 2.15% Fixed Rate Medium-Term Notes Due June 28, 2013 that Freddie Mac issued in the principal amount of \$100,000,000 on December 28, 2009. The aggregate principal amount of the 2.15% Fixed Rate Medium-Term Notes Due June 28, 2013, including the Medium-Term Notes issued pursuant to this Pricing Supplement, will be \$125,000,000. See "Description of the Debt Securities – Term Debt Securities – Reopened Issues" and "– Maturity, Redemption and Optional Repayment" in the Offering Circular. Interest on the Medium-Term Notes offered pursuant to this Pricing Supplement will accrue from, and including, December 28, 2009.
